

SPARKS GT Summer Program June 7-11 - Registration Opens March

The SPARKS Enrichment Program for Jeffco Gifted & Talented learners will be at Wheat Ridge High School from June 7-11. Registration will be open March 1-14 and enrollment will be by lottery. The Jeffco GT Dept. will send a registration link and course options to families of all students with Advanced Learning Plans or in GT Centers by the end of February.

SPARKS is a summer experience for district GT students entering 1st through 8th grade. Classes provide an engaging learning environment in a variety of topics for Jeffco gifted students. Classes will be limited to 15 students to maximize social distancing and safety procedures will be followed. Limited scholarships are available. Outdoor Lab Leader Scholarship - Apply by Feb. 20

The Outdoor Lab Foundation awards scholarships to college-bound high school seniors who have been a high school leader at the Jefferson County Outdoor Lab schools at least twice. Applicants must have successfully completed a week at Mount Evans or Windy Peak Outdoor Lab. Eligible applicants must apply for admission to any private or public vocational training program, college or university. Two scholarships for \$2,000 will be awarded to two different students. Each scholarship is \$2,000.



<u>Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado</u> <u>Scholarship - Apply by March 31</u>

VOC annually offers four \$5,000 scholarships to eligible Colorado residents who have demonstrated a commitment to caring for our environment's natural resources and intend to pursue post-secondary education through an accredited environmental, natural resource, climate, or outdoor industry related education program in Colorado.




<u>Lockheed-Martin STEM Scholarship - Apply</u> <u>by April 1</u>

Lockheed Martin has a scholarship program to provide opportunities to students. The company awards 200 scholarships of \$10,000 per student, renewable each year. Mentoring opportunities are a key component of the program, and recipients will also be eligible for Lockheed Martin internship opportunities following their freshman year in college.

<u>Davidson Institute Fellows Scholarships -</u> <u>Apply by March 10</u>





Applicants must submit an original piece of work that is recognized as significant by experts in the field and that has the potential to make a positive contribution to society. The scholarship may be used at any accredited college or university.

<u>Davidson Young Scholars Program – Applications Due First of Each</u> <u>Month</u>

The Davidson Young Scholars program provides free services designed to nurture and support profoundly gifted young people and their families, including talent development, educational advocacy, an online community and the Ambassadors program. Young Scholars can also access annual get-togethers, a summer camp for 8- to 12-year-olds and challenging online middle school courses.

<u>Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Young Scholars Program - Apply by</u> <u>March 22</u>

The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Young Scholars Program is a selective five-year, precollege scholarship for high-performing 7th grade students with financial need. It provides academic advising, along with financial support for school, summer programs, internships, and other learning enrichment opportunities.

Eligible applicants should:

- Be entering 8th grade in the fall of 2021.
- Have earned all As and Bs since the beginning of 6th grade.
- Reside in the U.S. and plan to attend high school in the U.S.
- Demonstrate financial need with a maximum adjusted gross income of \$95,000.
