Parent Seminar "Ask Us Anything" Questions + Answers

Last month, the Jeffco Gifted & Talented (GT) Parent Seminar "Ask Us Anything" offered a panel of Jeffco GT Resource Teachers, high school students, and JAGC parents to answer questions from the audience. Since we ran out of time to answer them all, parents in attendance wrote down the questions they didn't have an opportunity to ask during the seminar. CogAT 7 / ALP Parent Night

The Cognitive Abilities Test 7 or CogAT 7 is used to assess students' abilities in reasoning and problem solving using verbal, quantitative, and nonverbal assessments. Jeffco Virtual Academy Online Gifted & Talented Classes

The Gifted and Talented Department, in collaboration with Jeffco's 21st Century Virtual Academy (JVA), offers online GT courses. This school year the program will start with 7th grade core classes: GT Language Arts 7, GT Math 7/8, GT Science 7, and GT Social Studies 7. Classes are taught by certified GT teachers and offer the opportunity for GT students to participate in an engaging online curriculum that incorporates both the academic and social-emotional needs of gifted students.

Families may work with JVA and their home schools in order to arrange for their gifted children to take one or more GT class during their school day in their area(s) of strength. All students are required to have an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) and an eligibility form completed and approved by their home school's counselor or administrator. Jeffco Early Access for Kindergarten and First Grade – Applications Due March 21
Testing for Entrance to Kindergarten or First Grade for the 2019-2020 School Year
Colorado House Bill 08-1021, Early Kindergarten and First Grade for Gifted Children, extend the definition of "gifted child" to include four-year olds who may be able to access Kindergarten and five-year olds who can access First Grade, and adds a new classification of "highly advanced gifted child."

Early Access applies to children in the 97th percentile or above on standardized tests and functioning levels typically two years or more above peers.

For early entrance to kindergarten, a child must be 4 years old by Oct. 1, 2019 and for early entrance to first grade, a child must be 5 years old by Oct. 1, 2019.

How to apply for Early Access (cost is \$250):

- 1. Fill out the online application, which opened Jan. 2.
- 2. Once the application is submitted, you will receive an Early Access Packet (with portfolio requirements) and Developmental History Form from the GT Office.
- 3. The Early Access Packet, Developmental History Form, and **portfolio submissions** are due by March 21.
- Parents will be contacted to schedule Cognitive Testing (DAS-II Differential Ability Scales). Testing is typically scheduled in early April and takes approximately 2 hours.
- 5. If the child scores in the 97th percentile or higher on DAS-II, a second session will be scheduled to take TEMA-3 (Test of Early Math Ability), TERA-3 (Test of Early Reading Ability), and an observable play opportunity. This testing takes approximately 2 hours.
- 6. Notification of acceptance and non-acceptance is typically sent to parents by early May.

Become a JAGC Ambassador

<u>JAGC Ambassadors</u> are parent volunteers who receive training in how to serve GT students, parents, and staff at the articulation area and school building levels. Ambassadors can serve neighborhood schools, charter schools, home school groups and preschools.

Ambassadors help develop strong family-school partnerships. The process can be tailored to each school and Ambassador according to motivation and availability. An Ambassador's process for building successful partnerships and programs usually consists of raising awareness, taking positive action to cultivate involvement and celebrating successes.

Short on time? This is an understandable concern and we don't want anyone to feel overwhelmed. First, you don't have to be an expert. An easy-to-use <u>Online Training</u> is available that you can do anytime. Second, one of the main functions of an Ambassador is to get GT information (which we will provide to you) to members of your school community (newsletters, websites, Friday Folders, etc.) Third, you can always share the role with others in your school or articulation area. <u>Career Day for Girls - Transportation and Construction</u>

The HOYA Foundation started <u>Career Days for Girls</u> to encourage more young women to pursue careers in transportation and construction. Why? Because only 8% of the construction workforce is women. That fact carries economic implications and substantial opportunities. Over one week, girls – ranging from eighth grade to 20 years old – make five stops to engage with women, ask questions and tour work sites. Each company puts together a day long insight into their company and into the industry. Deadline for applications is April 5, 2019.

<u>CSU Global Business Academy – Application Deadline May 1</u>

The Global Business Academy is a two-week program for students in grades 9-11 from July 7-19 at CSU's Mountain Campus in Pingree Valley near Bellvue, CO. The Academy provides students with a taste of college life as they learn about entrepreneurship, decision making and negotiation, sustainable enterprise, personal financial literacy, ethics and more. Last year, the academy had 39 high school students from 14 countries immersed in the fundamentals of business, entrepreneurship, collaboration and innovation.

Applications will be accepted until May 1 but students are encouraged to apply early.
