SPARKS GT Summer Program - Registration Opens March 1

The SPARKS Enrichment Program for Jeffco Gifted & Talented learners will be at Wheat Ridge High School from June 7-11. Registration will be open March 1-14 and enrollment will be by lottery. The Jeffco GT Dept. will send a registration link and course options to families of all students with Advanced Learning Plans or in GT Centers.

SPARKS is a summer experience for district GT students entering 1st through 8th grade. Classes provide an engaging learning environment in a variety of topics for Jeffco gifted students. Classes will be limited to 15 students to maximize social distancing and safety procedures will be followed. Limited scholarships are available. Early Access for Ages 4-5 - Portfolios Due March 24

Early Access to kindergarten is for four-year-olds, as an exception to the normal age requirements per Jeffco Board Policy JEB. Middle Schoolers Can Earn High School Credit

The Board of Education approved changes to district policy on graduation requirements allowing middle school students who complete certain math and world language courses to earn high school graduation credit beginning in the fall of 2021 (Board Policy IKF). Middle schools are in the planning process to implement this change. Watch for communication from your middle school to learn more.

Remote Learning Option for 2021-22 School Year

Jeffco's plan is to offer full-time in-person learning for all grades, as well as a centrally run PK-12 remote learning option with synchronous instruction. Families will have the opportunity to select the central remote learning program for the 2021-22 school year in early March.

Details for the remote learning program are still being determined. Remote learning was ideal for some students who would like to continue with this model even when COVID-19 restrictions end. Families who want to continue with remote learning in the next school year should still complete the EnrollJeffco process (open now) if they haven't already. This lets Jeffco know which families intend to return to Jeffco Public Schools and helps with budget and staff planning.

Scholarships

Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado Scholarship - Apply by March 31

VOC annually offers four \$5,000 scholarships to eligible Colorado residents who have demonstrated a commitment to caring for our environment's natural resources and intend to pursue post-secondary education through an accredited environmental, natural resource, climate or outdoor industry related education program in Colorado.



<u>Lockheed-Martin STEM Scholarship - Apply</u> <u>by April 1</u>

Lockheed Martin awards 200 scholarships of \$10,000 per student, renewable each year. Mentoring opportunities are a key component of the program, and recipients are eligible for Lockheed Martin internship opportunities following their freshman year in college.



JCEA Scholarships - Apply by April 18

The Jefferson County Education Association (JCEA) awards several scholarships to seniors who attend Jeffco Public Schools.

-- The JCEA Excellence Fund Scholarship

Awarded to a Jefferson County high school senior entering college the following year to pursue a degree in education. Each scholarship is for \$1,000 per year and can be renewed for up to four years (\$4,000 total).



--Sue Anne Berger Physical Science Scholarship

Awarded to two graduating seniors from the Jeffco Public Schools who intend to study the physical sciences or related fields. Each scholarship starts with \$1000 and is increased by \$1,000 each year, up to four years (\$10,000 total).

-- The JCEA Shermita West Student of Color Scholarship

Annual award given to a Jeffco high school student of color who is pursuing a career in education. Each scholarship is for \$1,000 per year and may be renewed for up to four years (\$4,000 total)..

National Scholarships

<u>Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Young Scholars Program - Apply by</u> March 22 The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Young Scholars Program is a selective five-year, precollege scholarship for high-performing 7th grade students with financial need. It provides academic advising, along with financial support for school, summer programs, internships, and other learning enrichment opportunities. Eligible applicants should:

- --Be entering 8th grade in the fall of 2021.
- --Have earned all As and Bs since the beginning of 6th grade.
- --Reside in the U.S. and plan to attend high school in the U.S.
- --Demonstrate financial need with a maximum adjusted gross income of \$95,000.

<u>Davidson Young Scholars Program – Applications Due First of Each</u> <u>Month</u>

The Davidson Young Scholars program provides free services designed to nurture and support profoundly gifted young people and their families, including talent development, educational advocacy, an online community and the Ambassadors program. Young Scholars can also access annual get-togethers, a summer camp for 8- to 12-year-olds and challenging online middle school courses.
