Jeffco GT Dept Fall Center Application is Available - Deadline Oct. 14

The 2019 GT Fall Center Application is open through Oct. 14 at 4 p.m. This application is for students testing for the 2020-2021 school year. All GT Center testing has been completed for the 2019-2020 school year. There is only ONE application window.

Students who are ONLY seeking GT identification for an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) and who are planning to remain at their current neighborhood, option, or charter school, and NOT planning to attend a GT Center school should complete this <u>application</u>. The ID process could take several weeks to complete. Parents will be notified via email regarding GT identification and/or the creation of an ALP.

Moving to a GT Center Middle School? Here's What You Need to Know

If your student is in a Gifted & Talented Center elementary school and wants to continue on to a GT Center middle school, they will be offered a spot in their GT feeder middle school.

If your student is not in a GT Center school (currently enrolled in a neighborhood school, charter, or other school), you will need to apply for Middle School Center placement. **Applications are due Oct. 14.** If your student's gifted testing (usually the CogAT from 2nd grade) is over two years old, they will have to test again through the GT Center application process.

School Interest Nights (Showcases)

<u>School Interest Nights</u> are events where schools showcase their instructional programs and explain enrollment procedures. These Interest Nights are typically held late October through February, but can be anytime. If you are interested in certain schools, be sure to check the schools' websites for showcase days and times.

<u>Understanding Your Student's CogAT Data – Dec. 11 & 17</u>

If your child took the CogAT (this includes all district 2ndgraders), you should receive CogAT results in the mail around the first week of December. If you applied for Gifted & Talented Center placement, the decision emails will be sent to parents in early January. If your child was accepted into a Gifted & Talented Center, open houses and tours will be scheduled starting mid-January.

<u>Center for Bright Kids Western Academic Talent Search (WATS) Testing</u> for Gifted Students in Grades 3-9

The <u>Center for Bright Kids</u> (CBK) is the regional talent center in the Rocky Mountain area, serving seven states, provides summer and other youth programs. The goal of CBK is to offer K-12 enrichment and acceleration programming for high interest and high ability kids.

Testing runs from October-Feb. If your child has an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP), you will need to contact the Jeffco Gifted & Talented Department to receive the Jeffco GT Eligibility letter for WATS testing. Once they verify a student's GT status, they will send the letter to you electronically. Your child can qualify to test in other ways. If you allow results to be reported to your school district, at least in Jeffco, they will become part of your child's ALP, further aiding your child's teachers in challenging them academically.

In addition to their youth programs, CBK also offers testing without ceilings, provided by the Western Academic Talent Search (WATS). The benefit of this testing is to find a child's true potential in reading, English, math, and science at the given time they take the test. Typical assessments used by school districts only test one or two grades up, not demonstrating some children's true potential in a subject. WATS testing goes far beyond one or two grades. WATS uses ACT, SAT, and PSAT 8/9 tests. PSAT 8/9 is used for grades 3-6, while ACT and SAT are used for grades 6-9.

Colorado College FREE Application Day - Oct. 15

For the second year in a row, the Colorado Department of Higher Education has teamed up with colleges and universities all across the state of Colorado to waive college application fees for all Colorado students on Tuesday, October 15. That means if you submit your application between 12:01 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. that day, you can apply for free to any public Colorado institution and many private institutions.

Free School of Mines Petroleum Engineering Class

High school juniors and seniors who are interested in taking a FREE class at Colorado School of Mines (PEGN102: Introduction to Petroleum Industry) can apply for the Petro@Mines program. The application deadline is November 1. Questions and applications can be sent to Terri Snyder.

Name the Rover Challenge

If you are a K-12 student in the United States, your challenge is to name NASA's next Mars rover. Submit your rover name and a short essay (maximum 150 words) to explain the reasons for your selected name. The Mars 2020 rover will seek signs of past microbial life, collect surface samples as the first leg of a potential Mars Sample Return campaign, and test technologies to produce oxygen from the Martian atmosphere to prepare for future human missions.

<u>STEMblazers - Inspiring Girls in STEM</u>

Stemblazers inspires girls to visualize themselves in science, technology, engineering, and math careers and empowers them to pursue STEM professions. We envision a world where women feel confident to pursue STEM careers and are equally represented in the STEM workforce.

National YoungArts Foundation Competition - Applications Due Oct. 11

National YoungArts Foundation is accepting applications for its annual competition in the visual, performing, design and literary arts for 15 to 18 year-old artists until October 11. YoungArts winners receive valuable support, including financial awards of up to \$10,000, master classes with renowned artists, and performance and exhibition opportunities.

<u>Davidson Young Scholars Program – Applications Due First of Each Month</u>

The Davidson Young Scholars program provides free services designed to nurture and support profoundly gifted young people and their families, including talent development, educational advocacy, an online community and the Ambassadors program. Young Scholars can also access annual get-togethers, a summer camp for 8 to 12 year olds and challenging online middle school courses. Applications are due the first of each month.

Student Opportunities

<u>Colorado Student Leaders Institute - Application Opens Oct. 31</u>

Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI) is a state-legislated, summer residential program on the University of Colorado Denver campus. For one month each summer, Colorado's best and brightest students, chosen from a competitive pool of applicants, live and study on campus, and earn three hours of college credit. Students choose one of two majors: International Social Studies or STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Math), and explore diverse topics through a lecture series by university professors and 3 hands-on projects--Colorado Social Problem Lab, Short-Term Business Lab, and National History Day.

COSLI students do not have to be formally designated as gifted and talented students, but they must demonstrate through their application that they meet the academic rigors that the program requires. At least 50% of our students must be eligible for free and reduced lunch and/or first generation college students.

Academic Earth (List of Free Online College Courses) provides a collection of over 750 free online college courses from the world's top universities. This is one of the few high caliber organizations that offer MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses). MOOCs provide students (and parents!) a wide variety of courses that can feed them intellectually as well as their career (eg. nano credentials). From just advancing your understanding of best practices in education, psychology, or American poetry, these classes are just a click away and they are FREE!
