
#### Resources for Families to Start the School Year

Now that school has started, you may have questions about who in your school can provide academic and/or social and emotional support. Here is a list of Jeffco Gifted & Talented (GT) contacts to find yours: <u>GT Resource Teachers/Building Leaders/GT</u> Counselors

These staff members are available to support students:

- **School Counselors** (neighborhood schools): Counselors support the academic, career and social/emotional development for students through classroom guidance lessons, small groups, and individual student meetings.
- Social Emotional Learning Specialists (neighborhood schools): SELs provide direct support to individuals and groups of students that demonstrate a need for a little more help in the areas of behavior and social emotional skills.
- GT Social Emotional Learning Counselors (GT Center schools): SELCs generally support the academic, social emotional, and career development for gifted students in a GT center school. They provide classroom instruction, small group interventions, and brief individual counseling support. SELCs are also available for consultation with any school needing advisement in serving GT populations.
- **Nurses**: While school nurses do not provide direct, clinical support in the terms of mental health therapy, they do provide social emotional wellness support.
- Psychologists and Social Workers (all schools): Psychologists and social workers generally work with students with more specifically defined academic and/or social/emotional/behavioral needs as identified in their Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan, as determined by the school's Special Education team. These needs are typically addressed in smaller group settings and/or with individual students.
- GT Resource Teachers (RT): A GT Resource Teacher provides services to students, teachers, administrators, and parents in order to meet individual students' needs. GT Resource Teachers serve many schools and are not at any school on a full-time basis.

## Make Your Voice Heard at Your School: Why GT Parents Should Join School Accountability Committees

It is critical that GT parents are represented on every School Accountability Committees (SAC) to ensure that the needs of GT students are addressed.

It's not a huge commitment. SACs generally meet only five times per year. JAGC can provide you with the data and support that you need to effectively fill this role. Your school is required to give notice of SAC meetings, so if meetings are not posted on your school website and meeting notices are not sent, contact your school and ask for this.

Contact your principal today and tell him or her you want to join your School Accountability Committee.




### **GT Center Information Night Sept. 15**


- North Arvada Middle School



## Gifted & Talented Center Placement and Identification - Applications Due Oct. 15

The fall 2021 <u>GT Center Application</u> is for students testing for the 2022-23 school year for enrollment in one of Jeffco's <u>17 GT Center Schools</u>. For more information on the process, please visit the <u>GT Identification and Assessment website</u>.

Use the <u>Academic ID Referral link</u> if you are looking for GT identification only and not GT Center placement. Use the GT Center application to apply for a GT Center.

After your forms are submitted, you will be notified of your child's testing date, either on Oct. 23 or Oct. 30. This is the only testing that will occur during the 2021-2022 school year.



## **Advanced Learning Plans Process Underway**

Schools should be starting the Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) goal-setting phase, to be completed by the end of October. GT learners in Jeffco write one academic and one affective goal each year, to help them focus on actualizing their personal potential.
